1 Think about what story (or stories) you're going to tell.

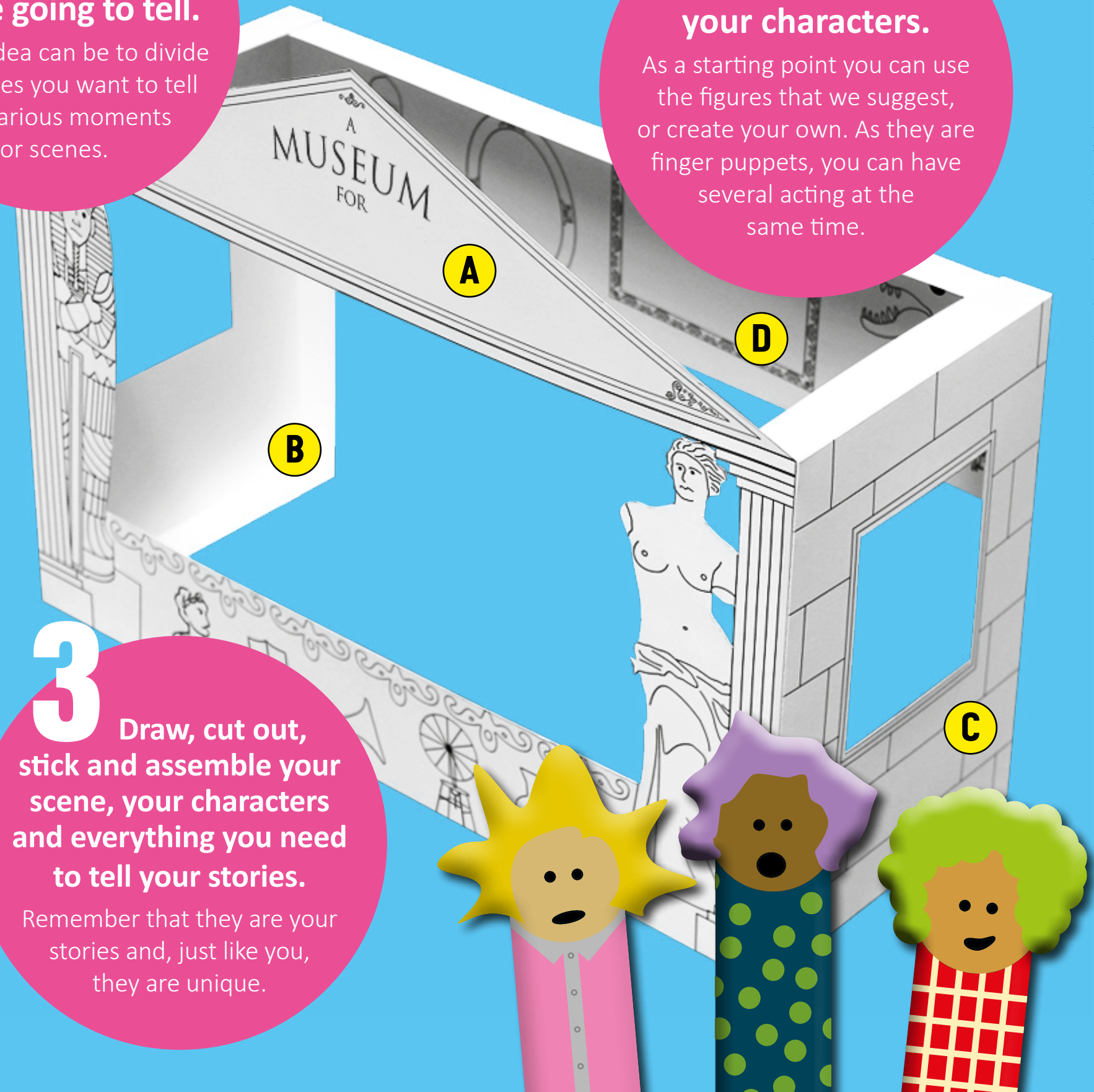
A good idea can be to divide the stories you want to tell into various moments or scenes.

2 Choose your characters.

As a starting point you can use the figures that we suggest, or create your own. As they are finger puppets, you can have several acting at the same time.

3 Draw, cut out, stick and assemble your scene, your characters and everything you need to tell your stories.

Remember that they are your stories and, just like you, they are unique.



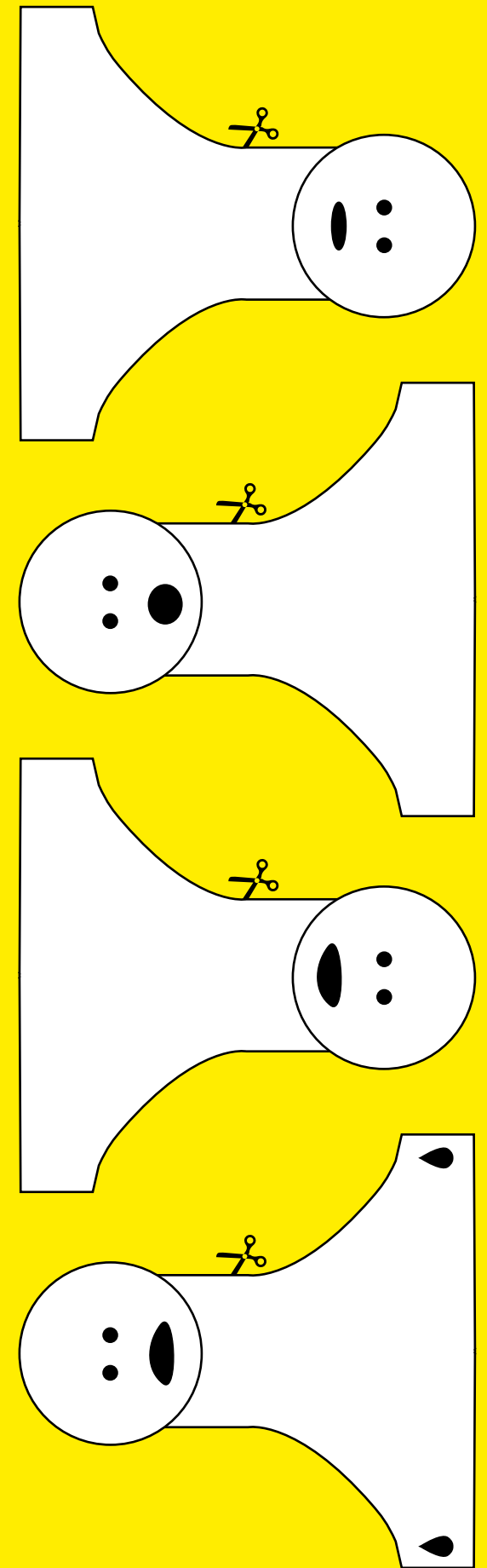

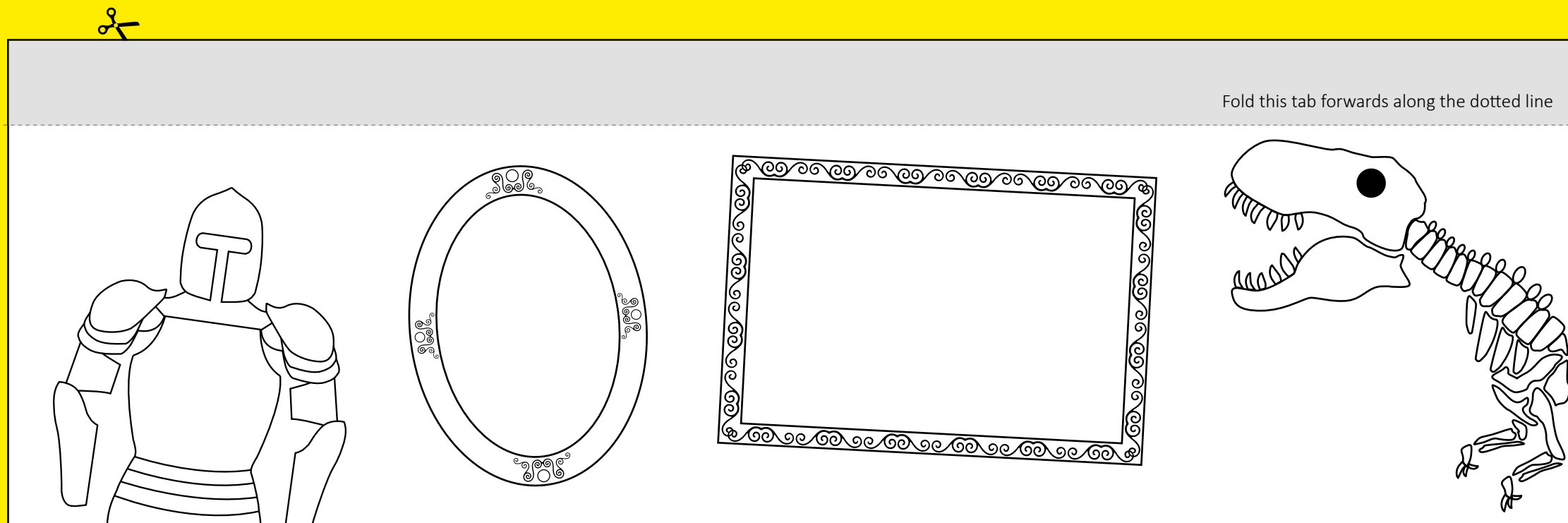
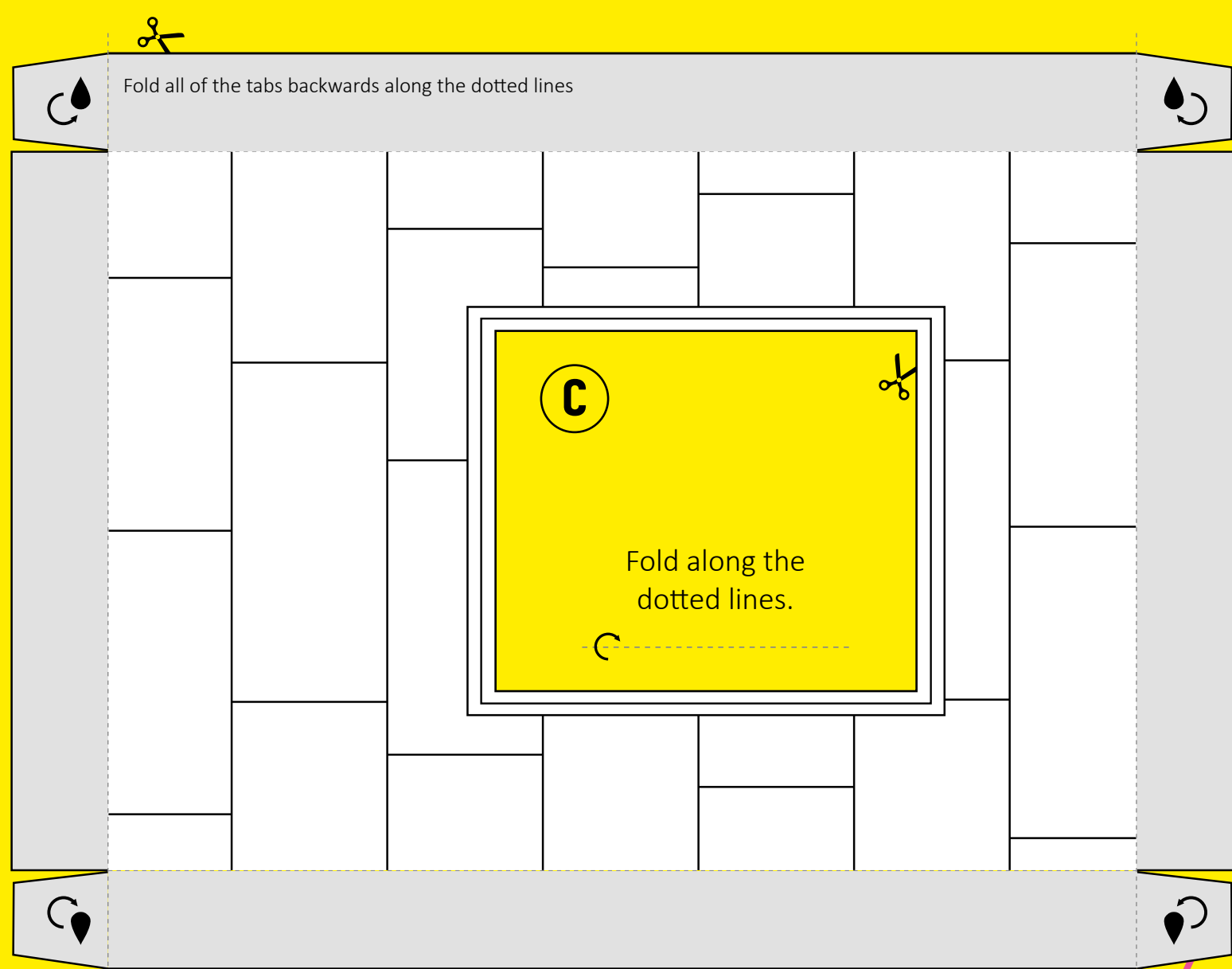
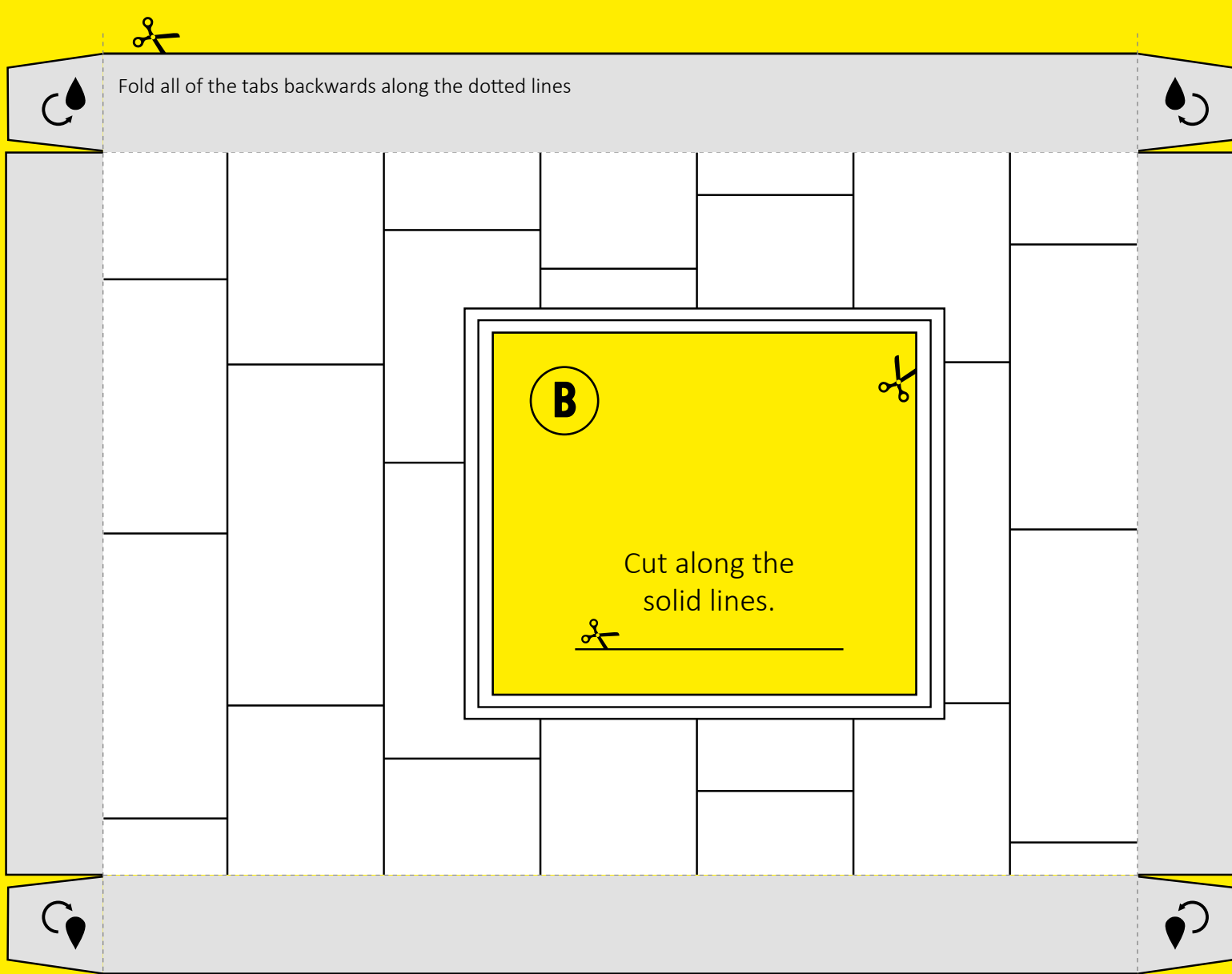
Assemble your characters
